## ELOSH main deliverables

The European Core Learning Outcomes for Integration of Support and Housing (ELOSH) will transfer **innovative learning results** and **training materials** on integrated support and housing, developed by Sitra, an expert charity on training in the field of housing with health, care and support. These materials will promote the co-production of services, including citizen's needs, as its core. Partners will blend and adapt these outcomes and tools to create a flexible European pack to be tested in seven countries by housing and support providers. Finally, results and training packs will be developed, disseminated and be available as an online resource.

## Why is ELOSH important?

In 2010, 3 out of 4 people in the EU thought homelessness had increased in their country over the past 3 years. **The facts are:**

At least **1,2 million people** with disabilities live in institutional care **in the European Union**, primarily due to the lack of community-based services, including housing.

**Greece's** homeless population rose by 25% between 2009 and 2011.

In the **UK** on 31 March 2012, the number of households in temporary accommodation was 5% higher than the same date the year before.

For several years now the number of places in specialised institutions in **Slovenia** has been increasing by approximately 1,000 a year.

In 2013, 2,303 persons were living in an institution, emergency accommodation or shelter in **Ireland**.

## What is ELOSH about?

**ELOSH** will contribute to the **fight against social exclusion of people** with support needs by improving cooperation between social support services and the housing sector.

**ELOSH** aims at transferring **innovative learning outcomes and specific training** material on housing and integrated support to 7 EU member states.

**ELOSH** uses co-production principles to **train staff members in the housing and support sector** by integrating users in the development and delivery of services.
