The PUSH network



- Growing understanding of the right to live independently, in the community, to choose where and with whom to live and to receive support in order to enjoy this right
- Right to housing
- **P**ractice and **U**nderstanding in **S**upported **H**ousing (PUSH)
- Practical exchange of models of integrated housing and support

Context



- Policy framework:
 - UN CRPD
 - UN Report of the special rapporteur right to adequate housing
- Socio-economic changes in population
- Diversification of needs both in terms of support and in terms of housing
- Research outcomes

Community-based services

- Individual with needs to be at the centre of our analysis and understanding
- Focus on individual needs and wishes
- Promoting enjoyment of human rights
- Deliver services in co-production with the users

Rationale



- Two key processes are driving service change: personalisation and deinstitutionalisation
- Focus on quality of life and individual needs

Address a need for Continuous Vocational and Educational Training for staff working with people with different support needs

How



- identifying and strengthening competences to enable staff of housing and support services to face societal and policy changes
- working with persons with support needs directly, in a co-production role

Target

- **STAFF** in the housing and social support sector
- **USERS:** persons with support needs including:
 - persons with disabilities
 - persons with mental health issues
 - persons with experience of homelessness

Key elements



- Cooperation across sectors (housing and support services)
- Co-production

Outcomes of the project

1. Develop a shared set of European core learning outcomes
2. Develop a training pack with co-production elements
3. Dissemination and promotion of the training across Europe
