Palle Adamsen, President of BL – Federation of Social Housing Organizations in Denmark

10:30 Social Housing is a good investment

Margrethe Vestager, Minister of Economic and the Interior Affairs and political leader of the Danish Social Liberal Party

Margrethe also represents Denmark in the ECOFIN Council of Ministers and her ministry thus deals with both the Danish National Reform Programs and negotiations on the Country Specific Recommendations under the European Semester. A sum-up of yesterday's impressions and presentation of the Minecraft Game.

BL has developed a new educational tool for elementary schools for discussing society and democracy, and for educating on the Danish Social Housing model and the story behind.

Minecraft is a sandbox indie game, which allow players to build constructions out of textured cubes in a 3D procedurally generated world. Other activities in the game include exploration, gathering resources, crafting, and combat. Minecraft is played worldwide by more than 40 mio. people.

The BL Minecraft project was developed to let a young audience learn about democracy, urban planning and architecture in a new innovative way. Using a Minecraft-model of a fictional social housing area urban communities and challenges connected to the real world can be explored. The project has already created buzz in the Danish schools and media.
